### Climbing back through time at Trinity Theatre's Clocktower Launch



We were thrilled to attend the grand opening of Trinity Theatre's clocktower in September. Having supported efforts to restore the historic tower as their community partner, it was an incredibly exciting moment to see the ribbon cut and the clocktower officially open to visitors.

Up until 30th October, visitors had the chance to climb the clocktower and explore Trinity and Tunbridge Wells' rich local heritage and take in the unparalleled panoramic views from the rooftop. While the 118-step climb is not possible throughout the winter, it will re-open in the Spring. In the meantime, visitors can still enjoy the clocktower experience, with an interactive kiosk available on the ground floor of the theatre, and online – allowing everyone to marvel at Trinity's impressive history year-round.

# Local Spotlight

Welcome to Thrive Living's 'Local Spotlight' series, where we celebrate local people, businesses and organisations. To mark the start of the series, we spoke to Thrive Living's resident photographer, David Bartholomew.

#### **Q.** How long have you lived in Tunbridge Wells and what's your favourite thing about the town?

A. I am proud to have lived in Tunbridge Wells my entire life. I've always admired the mix of architecture across the town from the 1930s art deco of the Town Hall to the historic Pantiles and Decimus Burton's influence. Buildings are fascinating; what they represent and the fact that many have stood for generations – if only walls could speak!

#### Q. What is the Tunbridge Wells Project?

A. I started The Tunbridge Wells Project back in 2010 to document the architecture that comes and goes in the town and allow the local community to see more than just the facades and public areas of buildings. My first project was the Town Hall, I told the Council that I wanted to record it all; from the roof to the vaults below! After documenting many buildings in the town, I was granted permission in 2014 to photograph the derelict former ABC Cinema building just before its demolition. In the past year or so, it's been a pleasure capturing its transformation into something new.

#### **Q.** The Cinema site has been derelict for decades, what impact do you think the new development will have on the town?

A. At last it will fill the huge void that has been in the centre of the town for so long. I think the new retirement community will help retail, which has really struggled in the heart of the town in recent years. I'm certain its new residents will really appreciate the vibrant central location with two theatres just a stone's throw away and plenty of restaurants - it's a great place for that generation to live and be part of the wider community.



### Site update

With groundworks concluding smoothly and on schedule, many people will have begun to see the buildings that will form Paramount Place, beginning to rise above the hoarding line, offering a taster of the view to come with a new development on this long vacant site.

The concrete frame of many of the buildings is up, and scaffolding is being erected to allow safe access to the higher storeys. Façade works are also beginning this month, creating the faces of the buildings fronting the street.

A revised pedestrian route will be introduced in the early new year on the pavement of Church Road as a necessity for safety. It has been timed to avoid disruption during the important festive trading period.
